Circle Of Honour Philanthropy Awards

The Foundation does not use any donations for Endowments for operations; 100 per cent of all gifts go to establishing the capital for an Endowment. One per cent from the earnings do go to operations, five per cent for granting to charities, and two per cent is reinvested in the capital.

Event ticket purchasers can direct \$30 out of the \$75 ticket price to their favourite charity. In 2007, 19 charities were recipients. This is truly a community activity. The Award Winners will be selected from individuals who are nominated by the public. Nominations Forms will be accepted until Feb 29th, 2008, with the winners being announced March 31, 2008. The actual Awards will be held May 31st, 2008 at Bay Moorings Inn.
