Our Mission in Action

Mental Health in Motion

For the past two years, the Huronia Community Foundation has made mental health advocacy a priority. With the support of HCF, Waypoint Centre for Mental Health Care, and the local community, efforts to dispel the stigma surrounding mental illness have flourished. This success can be seen through the increase in participation in mental health initiatives, increase in employment and life skills opportunities for people struggling with mental health issues, and greater support for mental health programing through donations and sponsorship.

The Huronia Community Foundation has supported opportunities to learn and talk about mental health issues in the region, funding two major advocacy events for Waypoint so far. Each year this community is becoming more compassionate and supportive of people faced with mental illness, and their loved ones. This progression towards an inclusive, supportive,

stigma-free region is thanks to the hard work and generosity of our local communities and the Huronia Community Foundation.

In an effort to dispel stigma, support mental health care locally, and improve the lives of those struggling with mental illness, Waypoint launched a community event, Mental Health in Motion. The event included a community run, walk, yoga class, and kids obstacle course to promote mental

wellness through healthy active living. The event took place at the end of September just before Mental Illness Awareness Week. The event was a success, bringing over 100 participants, most of whom had never visited the hospital grounds, 40 volunteers, over a dozen new

community partners, and raising over \$5,000 by the time the runners took their first steps.

Feedback from our participants was very positive and with a few recommendations to bring forward we look forward to next year's event. We were particularly moved by one story on social media shared by a gentleman who came in second place overall in the 5km run. The story discussed his experience coming in second behind an incredible young man, age 8, who surprised everyone when he crossed the finish line first overall. The story revealed just how caring this community is and how strongly we support one another. We look forward to seeing both runners again next year.

Those in attendance took the opportunity to get active, show their support, and learn more about mental illness.

What Are Foundation Funds?

Endowment Funds

Endowment Funds are invested to provide annual returns used for grants. There are several types of endowment funds to suit your needs. For details on how little you need to start a fund and the tax benefits please call 705-427-0339 or email info@huroniacf.com

Smart and Caring Endowment Funds

These funds were the idea of Governor General David Johnson in 2011. The three pillars of innovation, philanthropy and volunteerism suit the guiding principles of every foundation.

These are endowment funds invested in perpetuity and allocated to the foundation to be granted each year. They provide annual grants to charities and community organizations that qualify under our SMART AND CARING GRANTS PROGRAM. The funds provide grants to a wide range of programs and activities responding to our community's unique needs. The applications are submitted each spring. Our volunteer GRANTS COMMITTEE reviews the applications and recommends who should receive grants. Our Board of Directors makes the final decision on who will receive grants from this program.

Donor Advised Endowment Funds

This type of fund is invested in perpetuity and allows the fund holder the opportunity to choose a specific organization each year which will receive a grant from their fund. Generally they have chosen an area of interest such as youth or seniors or other sectors. Fund Holders are provided with an annual report and work with the foundation to fill the greatest needs in the community.

Donor Directed Endowment Funds

This type of endowment fund is invested in perpetuity and offers the fund holder the option of dedicating the grant annually to a specific charity or qualified community organization. The fund holder receives an annual fund report and works with the foundation to grant from the fund after March 31st each year.

Field of Interest Endowment Funds

This type of endowment fund is invested in perpetuity and can be for a very specific interest and remains the same each year. Areas such as arts groups, homeless shelters, education or the environment are some of the specific recipient areas.

Other Funds

Managed Funds

These are endowment funds which are invested for a specific period of time with the option to renew the investment. They can be donor advised or designated or field of interest. Charities or qualified community organizations can use these for special projects.

Flow-Through Funds

These funds are not invested and are structured to support charities and organizations as they hold special events or activities/projects but need access to the funds. The foundation can provide tax receipts to donors of qualified charities or organizations.

Grants & Giving

To apply for our annual SMART AND CARING GRANTS, please access the simple online application form found on our website each spring.

We also offer scholarships and grants in our region from private funds we manage. These scholarships are currently offered to MSS, St. Theresa and Christian Island students and grants are offered after March 31st each year. Our granting region includes Midland, Wasaga Beach, Penetanguishene, Tiny, Tay, Springwater and Collingwood. We are a federally incorporated charity so when you have a fund with us you can give anywhere in Canada.
